About The Meeting

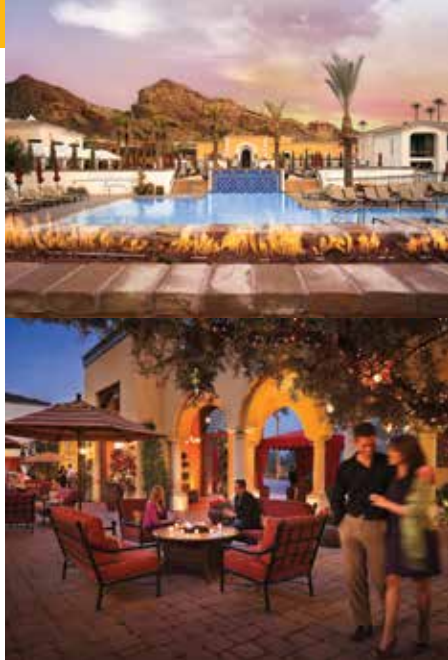
